

ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

From next week you will receive a text message if your child is absent from school without an explanation. Please contact the school office if you have any questions.

We have also introduced a form for families to notify the school when their child is absent from school on a family holiday. This form is available from the school office and on the website under 'Student Wellbeing'.

Between now and August, members of the Inclusion and Diversity Team and the St. Lawrence Leadership Team will be facilitating the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD) process. The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD) on school students with disability collects information about students with disability across Australia in a consistent, reliable and systematic way. The purpose of the NCCD is to build an evidence base that will provide teachers, schools and sectors with information on students with disability and the level of educational adjustment being provided. Also to provide an enhanced focus on the individual needs of each student by focusing on the level of educational support provided to them in the school context. From 2018, the Commonwealth funding for schools will be based on the NCCD. The information will not identify individual students. VISUAL ARTS NEWS

In Visual Arts this term, the Year 2s and Year 4s have been learning about Ephemeral Art and Public Art. 'Ephemeral Art' is art that changes or lasts for only a short time. 'Public Art' is artwork that is made or displayed in a public area, not in an art gallery. The Year 2 students worked in teams to cover a tree (pohan) and its branches (dahan) in coloured plasticine. This made the trees look bright and unusual, like someone had come along with a giant highlighter and coloured them in.

The Year 4s also worked in teams to create art this term. They created letter-shaped stencils so that they could write out messages in spots around the school. The students decided on the message that they wanted people to see. Sometimes these messages were empowering quotes, popular song lyrics, deep questions or quirky statements. They then shook sand (pasir) or sugar (gula) over the stencil to form their message, which would only last for a short amount of time.

Positive Behaviour Support focuses on strategies and methods that aim to assist

students to reduce challenging behaviours and increase pro-social behaviours. At St Lawrence we are working towards creating a climate where positive behaviour is explicitly taught and reinforced, and prevention approaches are emphasised.

All students participate in a weekly class lesson about positive behaviour. Sometimes a child may need a personalised lesson which usually takes place with a teacher during a lunch break in a safe and supportive space in the admin building. The focus for these lessons is on reinforcing our behaviour expectations so that children can learn to behave in a pro-social way.
