Over the coming fortnight in Inquiry, the Grade 6 students will continue their iTunes U course "Your Vote Counts". They will investigate how political systems in Australia and around the world work. In Reading students will continue to compare and contrast different persuasive texts, analysing these for purpose, audience and language features. In Writing, students will be writing, editing and publishing a series of informative texts, including explanations and persuasive texts. In Maths students will focus on time and solve problems involving timetables. Students will continue with the Religion Unit on Social Justice and will be exploring organisations in the community that promote social justice.
