STUDENT WELLBEING

The wellbeing of each student is very important to us at St Lawrence. We have recently employed a school psychologist, Bradley Drysdale, who is working Mondays to Wednesdays. He is providing counselling as well as behavioural and social skills support for students. If you feel your child would benefit from counselling please contact your child's teacher for a referral. There is no cost for this service. We have also installed a SENSORY SPACE in the grade 2 portables. The grade 2 students are enjoying this new space.



SCHOOL ROUTINES

A reminder that the school gates open at 8.30am. Children should not be dropped off at school before this time. Children are able to play in the courtyard or the oval before school. Families are welcome to go and see their child's teacher between 8.30 & 8.45am. The bell rings at 8.45am for the



students to enter the learning spaces and get organised for the day. The second bell rings at 8.55am for learning to begin. In the afternoon the students exit the learning spaces at 3.15pm and all children should have left the school grounds by 3.30pm. If you are not able to pick up your child by 3.30pm they should be enrolled in After School Care. Teachers have regular meetings from 3.30pm so families are asked to see them between 3.15 & 3.30pm. If you need more time with your child's teacher please make an appointment.
