Tips for Learning a New Language

Many of us in the St Lawrence Primary School community already know how to speak more than one language. The students in grade 6 have been talking about what it's like to learn a new language and these are their tips: \Diamond

- Never give up! Keep on practising.
- Try saying things even if you make mistakes.
- Try translating new words into your home language. \Diamond \Diamond
 - Listen to people who can speak the language already.
 - Notice if there are any words in the new language that sound and mean the same thing as in your home language.
