ATHLETICS CARNIVAL 21 JUNE

Throughout this term the learning focus in Physical Education has been Athletics. Students across all grades are learning the different skills involved in the various track and field events such as running, hurdles, long jump, high

jump, discus, shot put and relay events. Grade Prep, 1 and 2 students have also been learning different novelty events including tunnel ball and sack races.

Students have showed great improvement and enthusiasm each week as they learn and develop these skills.

A reminder that later this term, students will participate in our first St Lawrence Primary School Athletics Carnival.

The Athletics Carnival will be held on Friday 21 June with students from all grades participating throughout the day using the school oval and running track. The focus of this event is for students to participate in the various athletic track and field events that they have been learning this term. GRADE 2 EXCURSION

WASTE AND SUSTAINABILITY AT ST LAWRENCE

This term the students from grades Prep-6 have been learning about our environment and how to be sustainable in their Inquiry units. Part of this learning involved taking part in a whole school bin sort to determine the types of waste we produce at St Lawrence, and how much of each type we produce.

The environment team conducted the sort and organised the waste from two bins into the following groups: Organics, Paper/Cardboard, Co-Mingled Recycling, Soft Plastics and Landfill. After the waste was sorted, each year level viewed how the waste was grouped and were involved in a discussion where they responded to the key question, 'What surprises you about the waste at St Lawrence?'.

Each grade conducted their own bin sort in their classrooms following the same structure. This allowed the students to see the types of waste that were being produced in their own classrooms.

The students have been highly engaged throughout these activities and it has been great to hear the passion they have about the effect that waste has on our environment. Our next step to is begin looking at how we can reduce the amount of waste our school sends to landfill.
