TRANSLANGUAGING AT ST LAWRENCE

What is 'translanguaging?'

Translanguaging is also known as 'code switching' and it happens when we swap between languages. This could be because we've forgotten the word we want to say in our other language, or because we simply don't know the word in the other language. At St Lawrence, we are all learning to translanguage between English and Indonesian. For example, you might hear an announcement that is mostly in English, but ends with 'terima kasih' (thank you). Your child may hear their teacher say to the class, 'Semua, silakan get your book and duduk' (Everyone, please get your book and sit down). Our students are also practising their translanguaging in Performing Arts and Visual

Arts, where we only use the Indonesian word for something. For example, all the children say 'kertas' instead of 'paper,' 'terima kasih' instead of thank you, and 'Boleh saya...' when asking whether they may do something.

This term, our Indonesian focus words will be:

Week 1: silakan (please)

Week 2: terima kasih (thank you)

Week 3: saya (I)
